Some Cool Stuff To Share...

The Dolphin Class Dives into Arctic and Antarctica Adventures!

For several weeks the Dolphins dove into learning about the Arctic and Antarctica. When the cold weather hit, inquiry investigations stirred. When discussions first started, they could name but a few animals, and knew that they were both cold regions. During learning their interests were sparked, and after activities were completed their knowledge deepened. They learned that the Arctic is in the North Pole (where Santa lives), and that Antarctica is in the South Pole. They also learned that there are different animals in both regions, with the penguin living only in Antarctica. In addition, they carried out experiments with blubber fat to see how polar bears keep warm, learned that the plural of inukshuk is inuksuit and much more. Students shared their information with their parents who in turn contacted relatives with Arctic knowledge. Lisa-Joy Gunter from Frontiers North Adventures, Manitoba connected with the students via Google Meet and presented Arctic facts to the children. The Dolphins culminated their learning with a mural, painting the backdrop of an Arctic/Antarctica scene and animals from the two polar regions.












Pink Shirt Day
