Today is International Holocaust Remembrance Day. During our morning announcements we shared the following with our school community:

Today is International Holocaust Remembrance Day. The Holocaust happened during WWII. Today we honour the memory of the over 6 million people who were victims of the Holocaust.

Because of the Holocaust, many people were harmed, including those who were Jewish, Roma, Sinti, Polish, Russian, or because they had disabilities, or because of their political or religious beliefs, or because of who they loved. This makes me sad to think about people being hurt for being who they were.

During the Holocaust, some people stood up to protect those who were being hurt. They kept them safe and told others about what was happening. It did not stop the Holocaust but it did protect some people. Other people stood by and did not get involved.

Today reminds me that what we do matters. What you say, what you don't say, the actions you take, the actions you don't take, are the choices that you make. These add up to your character. When we work together to make good choices and to be kind no matter what, this makes good in our world. This is why we work at Hopewell to learn how to solve problems and how to be kind and caring, whether using our WITS or another strategy.

Keep thinking about what you can do. Say sorry if you make a mistake. Ask for help. Ask how you can help a friend. Speak up when someone says something

mean or hurtful. Help those who need help. Be kind. If you see something, say something. Together, we can make sure our school is a welcoming and safe place for everyone.

What you do every day matters.

Educators have taken this message to spark discussions in their classes about how we can make a positive difference in our community and reflect on how we can continue to be good to each other.

Thank you for your ongoing partnership and support as we work together to promote a positive school climate. Hopewell is a school community we can all be proud of.




