He is the architect of Access, Use, Understand, Create: Digital Media Literacy Framework for Canadian K-12 Schools and the author of many of MediaSmarts' parent, youth and classroom resources including Break the Fake, which returned the beloved house hippo to Canadian screens. He is a member of the Canadian Pediatric Society's Digital Health Task Force and has served as an expert on panels convened by the Sex Information & Education Council of Canada and the Information and Privacy Commissioner of Ontario's Strategic Priorities Advisory Committee.
