Progress Reports do not include marks or letter grades, but rather progress will be reported by indicating if the student is "progressing very well", "progressing well", or "progressing with difficulty". This report is intended to provide parents with an early indication of their child's progress and will communicate areas of growth.



DISTRICT NEWSCelebrating the International Decade for People of African Descent



On Saturday, November 25, local signatories to the United Nations Declaration for People of African Descent (UNDPAD), 2015-2024 will join together for a symposium to reflect and learn on commitments made and future actions.

June Girvan, Chair of Black History Ottawa and founder of the Ubuntu Collective noted that "August 28th, 2023 marked the 190th anniversary of the adoption of the Act to Abolish Slavery in the British Empire, 1833. Almost two centuries later, there is still much work to do. As the end of the <u>United Nations Declaration for the International Decade for People of African Descent (2014-2025)</u> draws near, we must decisively interrupt; celebrate our progress; and create our own legacy."

The symposium, entitled *Our Shared Legacy; Our History – Our Humanity*, will build on the theme of *Ubuntu*, a Zulu expression which centres on the notion of humanity towards others. Ubuntu embodies the idea of interconnectedness, kindness, compassion, and mutual support among people.

Conversations at the Symposium will focus on literacy, legacy, humanity, and dignity. Participants will gather in safe space conversation and reflect on the emancipation of slavery in the British Empire and its resonance today. Signatories to the UNDPAD will be given the opportunity to share actions taken in their respective organizations since the signing of UNDPAD. The afternoon will include a keynote address by Tom Zoellner, award-winning author of *Island on Fire: The Revolt that Ended Slavery in the British Empire*.

"This event is a tremendous opportunity for our community to come together for a momentous day of inspiration and reflection, and to build on our commitment to human rights and upholding the dignity of every person," said Michele Giroux, Co-chair of the Ubuntu Collective.

Attendance is open to the general public and will include representatives of the organizations that are signatories to the declaration, including the City of Ottawa, school districts, post-secondary institutions, community organizations, historical societies, labour groups, embassy representatives; educators, students and families.

The event is being hosted by the Ubuntu Collective, which includes representatives from Black History Ottawa, JDEC-Every Child is Sacred, National Gallery of Canada, Ottawa-Carleton District School Board and University of Ottawa, Faculty of Education.
