Grades 3 and 6 EQAO scores have been released. Hopewell, OCDSB and Provincial results (percentage of students at or above standard) are detailed below.

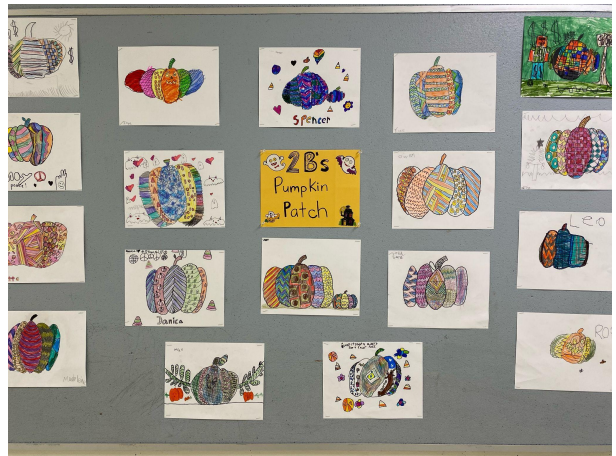
