Hello Hopewell Families,

It is hard to believe that we are now officially into our second month of school. This past week our Ultimate Frisbee team participated in their tournament and did a fantastic job representing Hopewell. Bravo!

Every September, as part of the annual OCDSB staffing timelines, enrolment numbers across the District are reviewed to assess whether or not class projections have been met. This year, student enrollment is lower than expected in several elementary schools across the District. While our school enrollment has not declined, we are slightly shy of the number of students projected by the board. As a result of lower enrolment numbers, there will be changes to the total number of classes and teaching positions across the District.

Unfortunately, Hopewell Avenue P.S. will face a reduction in our teacher staffing allocation, necessitating a reorganization of our classes (changing from 33 classes to 32). This will most significantly affect our EFI (Early French Immersion) classrooms in the junior divisions, specifically in grades 5 and 6. For the classes most significantly impacted, families have already been notified but there may be some slight changes to students' timetables as we finalize scheduling details.

We understand that a change in classes can be disruptive and upsetting to some students. We are committed to minimizing any changes and ensuring that this transition is as smooth as possible for everyone involved.

Thank you for your understanding as we navigate these changes.
